Each shift was fully manned with some non scheduled shedders coming to see what the fuss was all about. They turned out to be customers.

As you can see from the pictures, our outfit was well organized, well provisioned, well staffed and professional in our delivery. It really did look very impressive and all who saw it, let alone participated, can feel justly proud. Many customers took our brochures so it was a good promo for our shed as well as a fantastic fundraiser, more about that shortly.

Firstly, a huge thank you to all the shedders who committed to be there for a shift, some staying on during busy times to help get us through the rush. Our clean up was swift and effective so you would hardly know we had been there.

Secondly, a special thank you to those shedders who assisted in the planning, procurement and preparation of the essentials which on the day made our result incredibly productive. We were so busy that we had to send out for more sausages and onions and only just got to 4pm with the stock we had. Transporting the few supplies left over back to our "shed" at Braeside Park for later use eg. Drinks, with bread and sausages which could be frozen.

So, how did we finish up?? Preliminary results suggest we grossed circa \$1,600 plus \$44.60 in donations and after expenses of \$110.00 we netted circa \$1,535 for the day. What a brilliant result achieved by a fabulous TEAM effort!! Well done to all and a BIG thank you for being involved, especially to those who came to help out after directing traffic and the Farmers Market that same day.




### **SNAKE WARNING**
