What's new in the workshop

DIY SANDING

I have been asked what do the grit sizes on sandpaper mean?

In most tasks that require using sandpaper you will come across six of the standard grits.

These are:

40 -60 Coarse Used for rough sanding of objects such as Rough Timber. Plaster, Body Filler.

80 -120 Medium Used to clean up parts.

150 -180 Fine Used to finish most surfaces, before paint or stains.

220 -240 Very Fine Used where you require good finishes.

280 -320 Extra Fine This gives a very good finish to all surfaces, used on motor vehicles.

360-600 Super Fine Main use is panel work on motor vehicles.

While we are talking about sandpaper here are a few types of machines that make sanding a lot easier. These machines we have in the shed for your use after authorizing in safety operations.

Random Orbital Sander. A Velcro disc attaches to the sander and spins while moving in small ellipses.

Removes objects fast.

<u>Sheet Orbital Sander.</u> Paper held to sander by spring clamps. Paper can be cut in half. Mostly used for

finishing sanding.

Belt Sander. Heavy-duty use well for levelling joinery and removing paint. Belts come in coarse

and fine grits.

Detail Sanders. Small triangular shape. Fit in your hand well. Used for small hard to reach areas.



This shed is located on Aboriginal land in the Wallaga lake area about 6k north of Bermagui NSW. Location Umbarra Cultural Centre Akolele.

This shed's membership is just under 50, most over the age of 68 years, and operate Tuesday & Thursday 10am-2pm. A small shed that works on community projects. Members do their own projects along with many shed projects, & run BBQ's. The patchwork shop in town sells items made by the shed as fundraiser.
