If you have been to this place then you will recognise that it is Mitchelton Winery, located near Nagambie.

I was a young Project Manager for an architectural window company. Having completed all the drafting required for the design & manufacture of the restaurant windows for the tower section, all that was left was the installation. "Easy" I told my contractor as this building

has been designed by the great Robin Boyd and the restaurant, the observation deck located above and the unique roof for the tower are all actually at ground level and when completed will be jacked up some 55 metres into position. So now for the nightmares - delays in the window production and glass supply resulted in the builder not waiting for the window installation and the building was raised into its final position. This now meant that the windows and the glass all had to be hoisted up into position. That's when I became part of the installation team - a great way to overcome any fear of heights. PIGGY inspecting the finished picnic table - the joke about a BBQ and "get some pork on your fork" didn't seem to go over tell well.




The artificial turf matting then goes down and the holes are placed .... job done.




